desk they saw the basin, the water and the towel. The nurse told them that her job was to help people live healthy lives.





friends everything about seeing the nurse. "Now tell us about the special people you have met and seen," said Aled and Siân to their friends.



saw the Torah scrolls and the reading desk. The rabbi told them that her job was to help people live healthy Jewish lives.




